#### **PREVIOUS MEETINGS**

The June A meeting (on the 6<sup>th</sup>) was a video evening. Being unable to attend myself (in addition to my car being abandoned unlocked (due to the absence of keys) in a (thankfully gated and locked) field in Northamptonshire I was still exhausted after NFD) I am relying on the word on the street which is that several interesting items of amateur radio related stuff were presented including Mills on the Air station GB2KM (see write-up from Steve M0PEL). Also, the meeting was held in the Rehearsal Room at Trinity rather than the more normal Sandison Room and some of those present felt this has some advantages, including better acoustics and video display arrangements.

The B meeting (June 20<sup>th</sup>) was the usual "test gear and chat" session.

## **FUTURE MEETINGS**

The 4<sup>th</sup> July A meeting will consist of a "short talks evening" at which several presentations of less than half an hour each on different topics will be given. These will be:

- "Linking computers and radios" by Ray G4FFY
- "Further linking computers and radios" and "upgrades to the Minos contest logging program" by Peter G3ZPB
- "Using auto-ATUs with balanced antennas" by Quin G3WRR.

Please let the Committee know after the event what you think of this alternative format.

The August A meeting will not actually be in August at all but on Sunday 31st July! It will be the usual summer "outdoors with food" event and we feel that an afternoon session would be more suitable (warmer, lighter and perhaps more sociable) than an evening one. This implies that it should be held at a weekend for the sake of those who are still working! And as the nearest weekend to the first Monday is the preceding weekend, Sunday 31st it is.... This will be held at the QTH of John G3MCX starting at around 2pm. Following the success of last year's "Pastyrama" event this will again be a pasty based event rather than the more traditional barbecue. These will be provided by the club along with potato salad, soft drinks and beverages. If you fancy something a little stronger, please feel free to bring your own. Likewise, please bring folding chairs in case you feel the urge to sit down!

The September A meeting (5<sup>th</sup> September) will be a talk on "Vintage Radios" by Steve G3ZPS and will cover rigs (particularly those of the KW Electronics marque I believe) from the 1960s and 1970s.

The October A meeting (3<sup>rd</sup> October) will be a Surplus Equipment Sale – so bring some of your unused gear along for sale – and also cash to buy some new treasures which you will be able to re-sell at future sales....

The November A meeting (7<sup>th</sup> November) will be the annual Construction Contest. There will be prizes of real money (none of this Bitcoin stuff) for the winning entries – so why not get the thinking cap on and the soldering iron out?

The December A meeting will be held on 12<sup>th</sup> December – please note that this is the second Monday of the month rather than the first. This will the annual Inter Club Quiz, which will be hosted by Sutton & Cheam RS this year – hence the (for SRCC) non-standard date. It will be held at a Scout Hall in Banstead – further details on location will be provided in due course. Traditionally this has been a three way junket between SRCC, S&CRS and CATS but Chris M0TCH (the S&CRS "link man") is intending to invite the Dorking and Crystal Palace clubs along as well which should add to the fun. Clubs have fielded more than one team (of 4/5 members) in the past so why not have a talk to some of your fellow members so that SRCC can enter two (or more...) teams? Chris has asked for likely number of attendees by the end of October so I will be looking for inputs a bit nearer the date.

And finally it is expected that the December B meeting (19<sup>th</sup>) will be the usual Christmas Social – special.

#### **VHF NFD 2022**

Just a reminder that, as reported last month, VHF NFD 2022 takes place this weekend ( $2^{nd}$  /  $3^{rd}$  July). Members and friends will be welcome to visit and do a bit of operating or just call in to say hello and see the stations: they may even be offered a cup of tea / coffee and a biscuit! And if you don't fancy a trip into the Great Blue Yonder, why not come on the air and give us a few points? (but if so please work another station or two as working only your own club is – rightly - considered rather unsporting...) Stations on 6m, 4m, 2m & 70cm will be operating as usual, with Peter G3ZPB in charge of the 70cm station (G3SRC/P) , Alun G4WGE looking after 2m (G0SAC/P) and myself running 6m & 4m (G3WRR/P).

For those who have visited before, we will be on our usual site at Warren Barn Farm just off the B269 Limpsfield Road a mile or two South-East of Warlingham. For those who are not familiar with the site but who have access to an Ordnance Survey map, it is at TQ386565. But if not, it is still quite easy to find. Take the B269 Limpsfield Road (sometimes also called Croydon Road) in a south easterly direction out of Warlingham. After about 2 miles the stations will be clearly visible on the right. If you reach the mini roundabout at the top of Titsey Hill, you've gone too far! Turn into gateway on the right. The road is gated but if you call 07951 514074 or 07921 567651 we can remotely operate the gate. for access. **Please note** that Nick the farmer does not wish us to use the first turning on the left (on the level part of the dirt road) but instead to follow the road down the hill and take the angled track further down on the left. Follow that round up the chalk track until you see the stations above you and to the left. Please help us remain in our host's good books by observing this rule! #### **MILLS ON THE AIR 2022**

On the weekend 7/8th of May the Crystal Palace Radio and Electronics Club put on GB2KM at the Keston windmill with help from members of the Bromley and District Radio Club. We used John G8MNY's equipment. Many thanks to Jim M0JKM for organising this with the mill's owners. On site Saturday were John G8MNY, Adam G7CRQ, Jim M0JKM, Martin G7WIR and myself Steve M0PEL. We used an IC735 with a Drake L4B linear and G5RV for HF and John's Kenwood 2m radio for 2m about 35w to a 5/8 wave on a 30 foot mast strapped to this van. Martin operated the 2m station with 27 contacts including five mills - Brill windmill in Buckinghamshire, Thaxted mill and contacts into Cheshunt Herts, Upminster, Dunstable Downs and Hemel Hempstead. On HF Saturday were John G8MNY and myself M0PEL. We had 123 contacts, 16 mills in the UK and 4 from Holland all on 40m and other contacts from Scotland to Wales, Ireland and Holland.

On Sunday, Martin G7WIR operating 2m made 17 contacts including 5 more mills with contacts in Nutley, Chiltern, Brill, Watford, Rayleigh and Hendon. On HF, operators Sunday were myself M0PEL, John G8MNY, Damion 2E0EUI and Andy G4ADM. We had 165 contacts with 20 mills. Contacts included on 10m Israel, 20m Russia, Gibraltar, Poland, Helsinki, Budapest & Madrid and 40m Germany, Italy and Warsaw. We had visitors on Sunday - Justin G8YTZ and two members from the Crystal Palace Club.

A great time was had by all and the wx was bright and sunny. You will note I had a dabble on 5MHz (60m) which gave one of my new DXCC's of Jordan. 6m was also picking up during May though missed some of it due to Dog Agility shows!!"

<u>lan M0CGF</u> "May entry includes most of my QSO's from Guernsey and a few from home, good to see 6m open. A couple of PY on FT8 on 6m in this month's highlights. Last few days been working a lot of USA station on 6m".

Steve G4FYF "May log; usual stuff, different month; still good fun though"

<u>Rick M0LEP</u> "Last month's SOTA activity went better than average, with a few contacts into North America (though, unfortunately for league table purposes, all in K and none in VE) and one into Japan. Other interesting ones from a SOTA point of view were Svalbard and Iceland".

<u>Peter G3ZPB</u> "All in contests (2m FT8 and 70cms FT8). Nothing much to add really except it includes QSOs with 7 countries.

**Colin G4LZE** "83 points most of which have come from the FT4 contest"

As usual things were a bit less volatile in the cumulative listing, with the top four stations (Ray G4FFY, Ian M0CGF, Peter G3ZPB and Steve G4FYF) maintaining their April positions. Colin G4LZE and Rick M0LEP move up one place each to fifth and sixth respectively elbowing Quin G3WRR down two place leaving club call G3SRC steadfastly bringing up the rear.
